Is MTS Serbia a good phone provider?

MTS Serbia (Srbija/?????) by Telekom Srbija is the largest mobile operator in Serbia. It used to be the best option. However, its competitors have caught up on coverage and speed. It still does have a wide range of plans to choose from. Telekom Srbija is also active in Austria, Bosnia & Herzegovina, and Montenegro as m:tel.

What is the smallest mobile operator in Serbia?

Jump back to the Table of Contents. A1 Serbia (Srbija/?????), just A1 and formerly Vip Mobile, is the smallest mobile operator in Serbia. It is, however, the fastest mobile operator in the country. A1, as a company from Austria, is active in Belarus, Bulgaria, Croatia, North Macedonia, Serbia & Slovenia.

Which mobile operator has the best sim card in Serbia?

If you want to buy the best SIM card in Serbia, I recommend going with Yettel (formerly Telenor) or A1. Both mobile operators have the best coverage throughout the country. A1 has the fastest speeds. Consider MTS for generous allowances with its tourist SIM cards. So, who are all these mobile operators and what options are available for you?

Is international roaming expensive in Serbia?

The thing is, international roaming can be expensive. Serbia is an inexpensive travel destination, so it would be a shame to make your trip expensive because you felt the need to roam. Luckily, you do not have to. You can get a local SIM card, like a Serbian one, and enjoy local rates.

What eSIM discount codes are available in Serbia?

Here are some discount codes to sweeten the deal: Airalo: NEWTOAIRALO15 for 15% off (if you have never bought an Airalo eSIM before). Where can I get a Serbian SIM card?

You can get a Serbian SIM card for 300 RSD (2.75 USD) from MTS and A1 in their stores or from resellers, like convenience stores and kiosks. SIM cards are also sold at Belgrade Nikola Tesla Airport (BEG). Super cheap, right!? That is one of the pros of visiting the Balkan states - it is so cheap compared to Western Europe.
